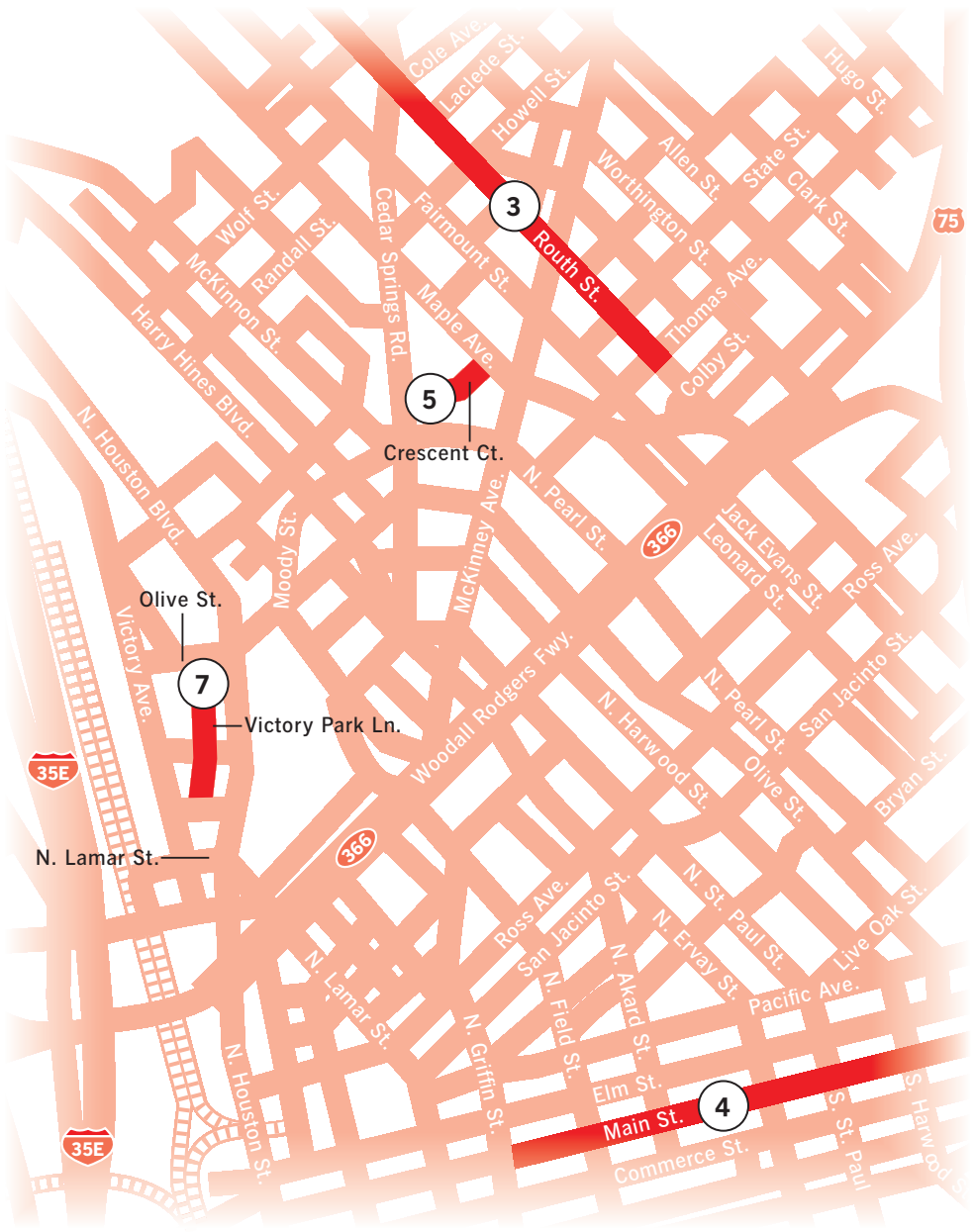
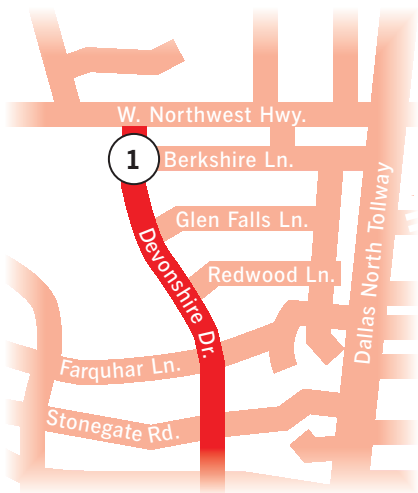


# Dallas

**1. Cabana** Located, quite literally, in owner Merry Voss' backyard pool house, this aptly named boutique is devoted to pieces with a vacation-ready sensibility, like Les Prairies des Paris blouses and Miss Davenport tunic. Note the unusual hours: Wednesday and Friday mornings, otherwise by appointment. **9115 Devonshire Dr., 214-674-9928**

**2. Forty Five Ten** This local legend feels more like a chic residence than a boutique. The shop is divided into sections, each with a warm, organic feel and a refined focus (look for clothing from Dries Van Noten, Y3, and The Row, plus shoes by Azzedine Alaïa and Marni). **3. Kacky & Carl** Situated in the ground floor of a 1920s brick home, this boutique offers party-

ready clothing and elegant hostess gifts. We turned up Madison Marcus tops, Karta sheaths, Parisian cake stands, and delicate glass carafes. **2722 Routh St., 214-295-4486**

**4. Neiman Marcus** This renowned luxury department store just celebrated its 100th anniversary, and the downtown Dallas flagship is where it all began. The palatial marble-floored location is still the best place to bask in the full NM aura: With a genteel refinement that's hard to come by these days, its hushed, calming environs make browsing for ladylike classics, like a Chanel bag or Manolo Blahnik pumps, an intensely rewarding affair. **1618 Main St., 214-741-6911, neimanmarcus.com**

**5. The Shak** This year-old offshoot of old-guard retailer Stanley Korshak has quickly proven to be one of the most on-point places in town to turn up refined

small labels like Nili Lotan and Rachel Roy. Just as impressive as the stock is the courtyard-facing space, which has the romance of a Parisian atelier with its double-height windows, iron chandeliers, and a sweeping staircase. **500 Crescent Ct., 214-871-3641**

**6. Studio Sebastian's** Long a standout for upstart labels, this University Park mainstay is also allegiant to more established names like Mayle and Jill Stuart. But its biggest draw is its shoe salon, which has all the big guns, from Christian Louboutin to Marc Jacobs, yet tends toward edgier styles. **6730 Snider Plz., 214-360-9001**

**7. V.O.D.** Just a month old, this light-flooded Victory Park spot is intentionally bare—so as not to detract from the cool pieces by names like Bruce, Brian Reyes, V.P.L., and Jeremy Laing. **2418 Victory Park Ln., vodboutique.com**
